

Maine Board of Overseers of the Bar - Public Source Index

GCF 26-240 and related public-record materials. Updated July 24, 2026.

Publication standard: this index separates complainant submissions, Board correspondence, direct court records, derived comparison exhibits, official rules, and commentary. A complaint or public criticism is not a misconduct finding.

Primary documents published

Document	Public release and purpose
May 15, 2026 new complaint	Nine-page public-redacted complainant submission. It presents GCF 26-240 as a new post-dismissal grievance and expressly excludes custody, parenting-time, and appellate-merits adjudication.
May 25, 2026 supplemental addendum	Two-page public-redacted complainant addendum requesting a substantial, record-specific professional-conduct investigation.
New and materially different grievance excerpt	Two-page public-safe navigation aid identifying how the submission distinguished GCF 26-240 from GCF-25-524.
July 8, 2026 Board letter	Public-redacted Board correspondence instructing the complainant not to submit additional information while review was pending.
July 21, 2026 dismissal	Two-page public-redacted Board disposition stating that the May 25 complaint was reviewed, dismissing GCF 26-240, and advising of public-member review.
January 6, 2026 Anderson letter	Direct court letter stating that a Motion in Limine contained "inaccuracies" and omitted later GAL appointments.

Comparison and verification aids

Four-page full comparison: side-by-side excerpts and focused review questions. Prepared by the complainant; it does not determine intent or misconduct.

Two-page summary comparison: condensed issue matrix for faster review.

Public source index: this document, describing the publication boundary and source categories.

Not published

The private-review ZIP and complete 39-page packet are intentionally excluded because they contain home and contact information, date of birth, child and school/provider details, extensive family-court material, and potentially confidential grievance content. The public page links the redacted primary submissions needed to evaluate the central record question without publishing the entire private file.

Official rule anchors

Visitors should read the current Maine Bar Rules and the Maine Judicial Branch description of the Board. The page links the official rules governing investigation, written reasons for disposition, public-member review, and special routing when a complaint concerns Board or Bar Counsel personnel.

Correction standard: corrections are invited by exact sentence and source. The website distinguishes a documented correction from disagreement over interpretation and does not present any complaint, dismissal, commentary, or comparison as a disciplinary finding that does not exist.
